

The "Managing Our Planet" seminar series is developed jointly by the George Mason University, the Brazil Institute and the Environmental Change and Security Program. It is based on the premise that the impacts of humanity on the environment (including natural resources) are at a planetary scale, requiring planetary-scale solutions.

Since 2011, the series has hosted 30 events at the Wilson Center ranging from issues of rising sea levels, the Millennium Development Goals, the future of food security and many more, while encompassing issues on sustainability and environmental resilience.

The series has brought leading members of the climate community to engage in a thought provoking dialogue with the audience and fellow panelists and has included documentaries, publication and book launches and art exhibits.

The seminar meets monthly during the academic semesters.
